Community Small Grants are available as part of **Pap Smear Awareness Week in May 2009**. The grants assist community and health workers to conduct promotional activities in their local communities.

Target Groups

Pap Smear Awareness Week promotes and encourages all women aged 18 – 70 to have two yearly Pap smears. Target groups for 2009 are:

- Low socioeconomic and isolated rural areas;
- Culturally and Linguistically Diverse communities;
- Women 30-45 years of age;
- Women over 60 years of age;
- Women with disabilities;
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities **

How much is the grant worth?

Community Small grants of \$500 are available.

When should the activity be conducted?

Pap Smear Awareness Week activities are between Sunday 3rd May and Saturday 9th May 2009. Some activities may occur later in May.
